## Cornerstone Village Subdivision Association Community Pool Rules and Regulations

## THE POOL AND BATHROOMS ARE CLEANED ONCE PER DAY

If there is an incident that requires prompt attention, please report the incident to the pool attendant, or call the incident reporting hotline at (586) 315-5452. In the event of an emergency call 911 or use the emergency phone located on the pool deck,

If the pool must be closed, owners will be notified via an alert notification and a sign will be posted on the pool gate. If your pool card does not work or you are not receiving alerts, please contact ALK via email at **info@alkmanagement.com** or by phone at (586) 850-4860 /4861.

To ensure the health, safety and enjoyment of all residents and guests using the pool, the Community Pool Rules and Regulations, as set forth by the Cornerstone Village Association, the CDC, and state and local governments, must be adhered to. Failure to comply with ANY of the following rules will result in immediate suspension of pool usage for up to 60 days. Please ensure everyone in your household reads and understands the rules set forth:

By using your pool access card, you acknowledge that everyone in your household, and your guests, understand and will follow the pool rules set forth herein. No exceptions.

There is one card or FOB assigned per household. Do not loan out your pool card to friends or other homeowners; this will result in suspension of pool privileges.

Pool Hours are from 11:00am to 9:30 pm daily. The pool will open on Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and will close at the end of the day on Labor Day. Please exit the pool before 9:30pm. The card reader system will shut down after pool hours.

Fence jumping is prohibited.

Entry into the pool is permitted on the pool deck through the scanner system on the outside gate only. Access cards are active for homeowners who do not have a balance owing on their account or an open/unresolved violation. If your card does not work, do <u>not</u> ask another owner for access, contact ALK.

There is no lifeguard on duty. The pool attendant is not a lifeguard. DO NOT swim alone. Make sure someone is on deck.

Per Health Department guidelines, swimmers must take a shower at the outside shower before entering the pool.

Do <u>not</u> enter the pool area if you are not feeling well or if you have any infections or contagious illnesses or open wounds.

Lifesaving equipment is not to be used for play.

Children wearing diapers are not allowed in the pool at any time. Swim diapers only.

No pets are allowed in the pool area.

A uniformed pool attendant will be on-site at the pool during open hours. There are also functioning security cameras at the pool which can be accessed if necessary.

If you, your family members, or your guests have an accident which involves body fluids (i.e. urine, feces, or blood), please report the incident to the onsite attendant or to the pool manager through the incident reporting hotline.

Residents and guests who cannot swim should not use the pool facilities unattended.

NO glass, alcohol, or smoking is permitted on the pool deck. This includes glass goggles.

Residents, family members, and guests must clean up after themselves and care for the pool and facilities as they would care for their own property. Pick up any trash or debris left behind on the pool deck or in the bathrooms before leaving the premises. Throw trash in trash receptacles. If a cleaning service must be called into clean up a mess, the household to whom the pool card is assigned will be billed accordingly. Items left at the pool after closing time will be considered abandoned and will be discarded.

No running, pushing, ball playing, diving, rough housing, offensive behavior or language, or excessive noise of any kind will be permitted around the pool area. Remember, this is a community pool. Please be mindful of the enjoyment of others who are also using the pool. <u>Any damages of association property will be billed to the responsible homeowner.</u>

NO large pool toys are permitted at the pool. This includes inner tubes, floats, or boats, which would impede on the enjoyment of other swimmers. No remote-control toys are permitted in the pool.

Lost pool cards should be dropped in the secured drop box at the front of the clubhouse, and then ALK should be notified. The box is not regularly checked. There is a \$25.00 fee to replace lost or broken cards.

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
